

## Cardiologist Reveals the Heart Disease / Gum Disease Connection



## Hattiesburg cardiologist explains gum and heart link

"If you have an infection in your gums, that can lead to the development of plaque in your heart," said cardiologist Dr. Dan Skarzynski.

According to Skarzynski, it all has to do with how your body responds to fighting an infection.

"The science behind the heart health/ gum health connection is well documented," said Dr. Panahpour. "It would be 'old news' to scientists but surprisingly, it is still not well-known to the general public. Read some of the studies that support the heart disease / gum disease connection here.

"Those same agents that are fighting bacteria can enter the vessel and go on to form plaque," Skarzynski said.

Skarzynski recommends that "the health of your teeth and gums should be monitored just like your blood pressure or cholesterol when it comes to your heart health."

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
